# What to Do Before Your Chicks Arrive

# **Congratulations!**

You are a participant in the 4-H Chick Chain project and will soon be receiving day old chicks. There are several things you need to do BEFORE your chicks arrive to have a successful project.

# **Setting Up For Success**

First, please review the Growing Blue Ribbon Pullets Book on our website:

https://extension.tennessee.edu/Overton/Pages/Chi ck-Chain.aspx. This manual covers important points such as housing, brooding, equipment, feeders and waterers, and nutrition.

#### **Heat Source**

This can be 100 to 250 watt infrared lamp. Whatever type of heating system is used, be sure to turn it on 2 days before to get the environment to 95 degrees.

#### Water Source

Use two 1 quart fountain-type waterers the first week. Dip their heads into the water so they learn where to get the water from. If they are not drinking a lot, add a spoon of sugar to the water to encourage them. Add larger waters as the weeks go on.

#### Feeders

Small feeders to start. One inch of space per bird. For birds age 206 weeks, use trough feeders or tube type feeders with 2 inch space per bird. At 6 weeks, provide 3 inch per bird.

# Housing

Before the chicks arrive, the house should be cleaned and disinfected. Then after the house is dry, cover the floor with 3 inches of clean dry litter. A day or two before, the heat source should be turned on and checked to see that it is operating properly.

### **Almost Ready**

- Each pullet will eat around 20 pounds of feed if fed properly. Buy in bulk to save money.
- Make sure you have a box to get the birds with.
- Bring food with you for the birds.
- Arrive to the Extension Office first thing in the morning on arrival day. Pair up with other participants to make it easier.
- Review the Record Book ahead of time. Have it in the car with you before or after school to update to save time.



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
