2025 4-H Chick Chain Program

This project requires that 4-H members have a place to raise and care for 14 chickens. Have you ever wondered what it takes to raise chickens from being a day old to when it can lay an egg? Do you want to try raising some chickens on your own? How does starting your own egg-selling business as young as a 4th grader sound? These are all things that 4-H'ers have been doing for DECADES with the 4-H Chick Chain!



Who can participate?

Any 4-12th grader enrolled in 4-H through public school, virtual/remote learners, or the home school program.

Why participate in the 4-H Chick Chain Program instead of purchasing birds on your own?

- ✓ Includes 14 Pullets
- ✓ Includes a Bag of Feed
- ✓ Includes an Introductory Class, Care Skill-a-thon Virtual Meetings, Showmanship Clinic
- ✓ Builds a community of young farmers

How Does the Chick Chain Project Work?

- If you want to participate in the chick chain, mail a copy of the 2025 application with your deposit.
 There are two payment options this year:
 - \$45 for Black Sex Link Breed
 - \$55 for Rhode Island Blue, Silver Laced Wyandotte, Speckled Sussex Breeds

Your deposit will be refunded to you upon successful completion of the program (bring 3 birds to auction).

- A minimum of 15 4-H members must apply to have the 2025 Chick Chain Program. If we fail to meet the minimum requirement, we will refund all deposits.
- 3. First-time participants are required to participate in the poultry introduction class on Friday, February 9th.
- 4. Below are the other dates for this program:
 - February 7th, 2025: Intro Class- former graduates of the program do not have to attend.
 - March 7th Pre-Chick Arrival Planning and Skilla-thon
 - Week of March 24th: Tentative Pick up chickens at COOP, date TBA
 - April 9th, 2025; Virtual Meeting Care and Skill-athon

 - September 6th: Auction TENTATIVE
- 5. All 4-H'ers will receive **14** chicks to raise, around March 24th, 2025. All birds will be properly vaccinated.
- All 4-H'ers will bring a <u>minimum</u> of three chickens to the show and sale on September 6th, 2024, or be penalized \$50 <u>in addition</u> to forfeiting their deposit.
- If the show is canceled due to outstanding circumstances, we will keep the deposit to be able to have the chick chain in future years.
- 8. The Chick Chain Auction will be held approximately 23 weeks after the birds are received, September 6th (tentative). The 4-H'er MUST BE PRESENT FOR THE ENTIRE SHOW to receive their deposit back. You will be required to RSVP.
- 9. <u>If your birds die,</u> contact us <u>ASAP</u> for an alternative plan to earn your deposit back.
- 4-H'ers will compete to receive the highest award for their breed of bird, Grand Champion. <u>The</u> <u>auction donations and bids are for future year</u> <u>programs.</u>

When and how do I register?

While you are encouraged to turn it in early, you must turn in your deposit by December 3rd, 2024. <u>MAIL OR RETURN THE APPLICATION AND DEPOSIT TO THE UT/TSU EXTENSION OFFICE</u>.

<u>DO NOT TURN IT IN AT YOUR SCHOOL</u> UNLESS YOU ARE AT WILSON ELEMENTARY SCHOOL. IF YOU ATTEND WILSON ELEMENTARY, YOU WILL BE PERMITTED TO TURN IT IN TO ANITA PHILLIPS.

2025 Chick Chain Application

By filling out this application, you understand the requirements of the chick chain project. If a 4-H'er does not bring back their 3 pullets, they will forfeit their deposit PLUS an additional fee of \$50. Failure to comply with the agreements will result in the 4-H'er being ineligible to participate in future chick chain programs. The income from the pullet sale is used to buy chicks for the next year and keep the chain going. Failure to meet these conditions will result in disqualification from future chick chains and other paid 4-H programs.
