The products we study are real products that youth will buy one day.

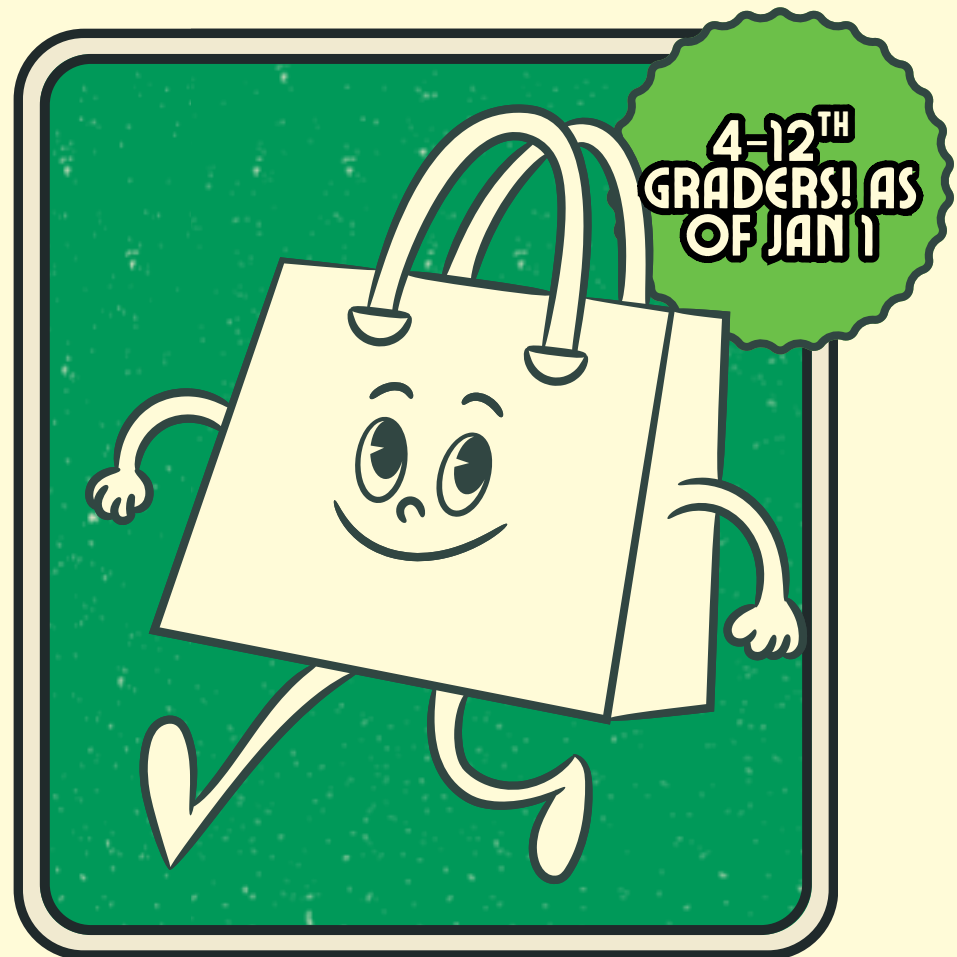
The regional categories will be announced in the summer.

GUIDELINES FOR PARTICIPATING IN THE 4-H CONSUMER DECISION MAKING TEAM

- Youth must be enrolled in 4-H.
- Youth must be in 4th-12th grade as of January 1, 2026.
- Youth will either compete as an individual and/or compete as a team (3-4 individuals).
 - Juniors (4th-5th grades as of Jan. 1) will do all of the ranking classes and one questions class.
 - Junior High (6th-8th grade as of Jan. 1) will do all of the ranking classes, both sets of questions classes and group think.
 - Senior High (9th&12th grade as of Jan. 1) will do all of the ranking classes, both sets of questions classes, oral reasons, and group think.
- All youth must follow the Overton County Code of Conduct and all 4-H rules and guidelines.
- On the day of the competition, the following attire must be worn.
 - Region Contest
 - 4-H Consumer Decision Making T-Shirt or a Polo
 - Black or tan/khaki pants
 - Closed Toed Shoes
